The Promoting Future Educators Scholarship Details

Once again this year's scholarship winners are clearly outstanding students. Here are some criteria for applying for the scholarship:

- You are a graduating senior from a high school located in Adams, Franklin, or York counties.
- You have been attending school in the same school district for at least six (6) years.
- You are planning to attend a post-secondary training program that will certify you to work with special education students in the public schools.

Scholarship evaluators look at the following categories to score the applicants:

- Student Rank and GPA
- SAT and/or ACT scores
- Extracurricular activities and Community involvement
- Depth of answers and understanding exhibited in the response to the goals and aspirations essay questions
- Quality of character aspects displayed through letters of recommendation
- Financial need
- How closely the student's major/career goal relates to assisting students with special needs in public school

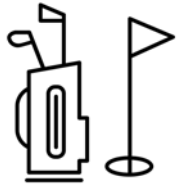
Emily Glass

Rules of Play



Tees: Men play from Hybrid Tees

Women play from Red Tees

Senior men play from Senior White Tees (65 & over)

Format: Normal scramble best ball format. Everyone hits his/her drive and selects the best shot. Everyone hits his/her second shot from that point and so on until the ball is holed in the cup. Only one score is posted per hole. Each team must use two drives from each player.

Rules: USGA rules apply, except for the following local rules:

A. One club length rule everywhere, but ball must remain on the same type of surface. For example, do not move ball from rough to fairway or sand trap to grass.

B. To keep play moving, do not record any score higher than a bogey (one over par) for that hole.

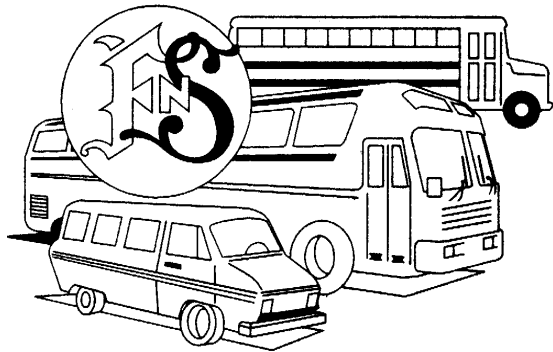

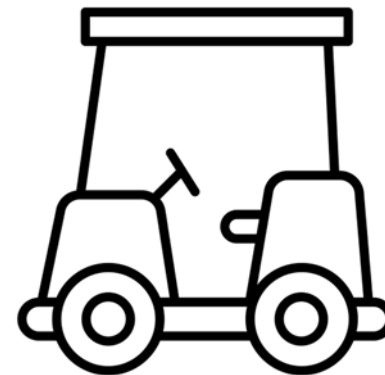
